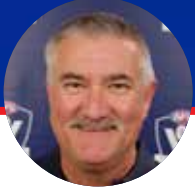

CHAIR REPORT AGM 2022

CRAIG KEATING

This 10th Annual General Meeting of the AFL Barwon Football Commission Ltd is able to report the successful “bounce back” from the Covid-19 Pandemic that severely impacted our Communities over the past two years. The hard yards that our Community Football and Netball clubs have navigated with great diligence and skill in 2020 and 2021 have been rewarded with a complete season of Football and Netball in 2022 that by any measure has been outstanding. Our army of volunteers has done a remarkable job given the challenges of the return to play protocols and the adaptation to a raft of changes to how we all work, rest and play. Our participation rate in Football and Netball at all levels has not only returned to pre-Covid levels but is demonstrating growth that exceeds the expectations of most administrators. Our Female Football competitions continue to thrive and the growth in Junior and Senior Netball numbers is most impressive. The record breaking attendances at our Finals across all formats and age groups showed the massive interest in Community Sport in our region and is a great credit to the leadership and enthusiasm of club administrators and volunteers.

The one area of concern is that our Clubs have reported a drop off in the return to volunteering. It is hoped that the successful completion of Football and Netball finals will remind everyone how rewarding it can be to belong to one of our Community Clubs and to participate actively in our games of Football and Netball. AFL Barwon is currently working with the AFL to provide much needed assistance to Regions, Leagues and Clubs with the intention of being able to provide training, support and other benefits to volunteers. There are significant resources being directed to this process and an ongoing funding stream that will be linked to the revenues of the game at the highest level. The revenue streams will be ongoing and as the AFL industry revenues increase the funding levels in the program will increase commensurately.

The enhanced use of technology will be part of the solution to reducing the volunteer workload. It needs to be acknowledged that the introduction of new operational systems such as PlayHQ can be seen as a burden in the initial stages of change. AFL Barwon is committed to supporting our Clubs and Leagues in adapting to the new platforms and ensuring that assistance is available to make this a positive experience. AFL Barwon has been very active in providing feedback to the platform designers who are continually reviewing the functionality of PlayHQ. The AFL is very aware that the transition to the new platform requires investment and commitment from all parties and is committed to providing the necessary support.

Another challenge in the AFL Barwon region is to be able to provide the infrastructure to match the growth in participation. The G21 & AFL Barwon Regional Strategy – Towards 2030 is an important piece of work to inform and advocate for the provision of facilities to enable the growth of our participation numbers to continue. The rapid growth in our female participation creates the urgent need for the provision of appropriate change room facilities for all participants and for the expansion of the number of playing fields and Netball courts in the region. All of this at a time when Governments at all levels are constrained by budget deficits. We must continue to advocate for the continued investment in Community Sport by Government and our Peak bodies. At the same time we will need to be prepared to maintain our own financial viability and be prepared to demonstrate our own commitment to plan and invest in our Club facilities, which includes adherence to Salary Caps and other policy measures that promote Club sustainability. We will need to remain vigilant to make sure that there is always a focus on prioritising the provision of active Communities through our local sporting clubs.

AFL Barwon is grateful for the support of our Football and Netball Umpiring bodies in our region. As with club volunteer numbers there

has been a reduction in the numbers of Umpires returning to the game post Covid. There will be a focus on improved recruitment and retention of Umpires but it is not only the role of the Umpire representative bodies to grow the participation in Umpiring. There is an important role for Football and Netball clubs to play in this space to provide a safe and respectful environment for Umpires. Clubs can also be proactive in encouraging members and participants to consider becoming Umpires or being advocates for our Umpires.

The Strategic Planning process is currently underway. InsideEDGE has been commissioned to lead the workshops and provide support for the process. AFL Barwon looks forward to all stakeholders engaging with this process over the coming weeks to be a part of the future planning for Football and Netball in the region.

It is important to acknowledge the excellent work of the AFL Barwon Operations team. It was a very difficult time for many workplaces during the Covid lockdowns. AFL Barwon was no different. Whilst the JobKeeper payments allowed us to maintain our staff profile, the post lockdown period provided opportunities for some valued staff to advance their careers beyond AFL Barwon. The team members who took the opportunity to advance their careers beyond AFL Barwon did so with the best wishes and thanks of AFL Barwon. Under the leadership of Region Manager, Ed Wilson, AFL Barwon has assembled a vibrant team to take us forward and to provide our stakeholders with industry leading support. AFL Barwon is committed to providing our staff with the environment that will enable them to identify their aspirations and see them progress their careers. You will read elsewhere in this Annual Report of the work done by our team in their respective departments. I am sure you will all join in thanking them for their considerable efforts.

AFL Barwon recognises the great service provided by our three outgoing Commissioners since our last AGM. Ian McTaggart and Richard Underwood both stood aside as Commissioners as they had served three terms and under the requirements of the Constitution were required to do so. Pip Jankowski resigned from the Commission in February 2022 having served one three year term. Our Region is very fortunate to have enjoyed the committed work of these three Commissioners, all of whom have continued to offer support and advice to Football and Netball in AFL Barwon. During 2022 the Commission has been able to fill the vacant Commission positions following a recruitment campaign. The new appointees are Ashley West, Mick Overman, Diana Murase and Mark Wilken. The new Commissioners bring great skills that meet the identified needs of the Commission.

At this AGM I complete my third term as a Commissioner and I will not be standing for re-election under the terms of the Constitution. I take this opportunity to thank Commission Deputy Chair Michelle Gerdtz for her unstinting support to me and to the Commission. Michelle has served three years in this role and is a tremendous asset to the Commission and to Football and Netball in the region. I thank all other current and past Commissioners for their great work and contribution to Football and Netball since the inception of AFL Barwon.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge the Leagues, Clubs and Stakeholders for their commitment to Football and Netball and I hope that we can all work co-operatively to ensure the ongoing success of our Community Football and Netball Clubs. This Region is blessed with the greatest volunteers and Club leaders in Community Sport. Long may it continue to be so.

FOOTBALL OPERATIONS REPORT

MICHAEL LIMB

SENIOR FOOTBALL & UNDER 18 FOOTBALL

After the disappointment of 2020 & 2021 it was very satisfying to once again complete full seasons and finals series for all competitions. The levels of excitement and enjoyment were obvious throughout the season, but especially during the finals series where we entertained record crowds at all levels of competition.

COLTS (UNDER 18S)

In response to club feedback, the age group was adjusted from Under 19 to Under 18. We conducted 3 divisions comprising 25 teams which was a slight increase from 22 teams in 2021, with 12, 7 & 6 teams competing respectively in each division.

In Division 1, St Joseph's dominated the home & away season with only one loss, St Mary's, Newtown & Chilwell and Torquay completed the top 4 positions with 3 losses each and Geelong West Giants finished 5th with 5 losses. After a closely contested finals series, it was Newtown & Chilwell who were victorious with a hard-fought win over St Joseph's in the Grand Final. Francesco Posterino from Newtown & Chilwell won the League Best & Fairest and Jarvis Miles from St Joseph's was the Division 1 Leading Goalkicker.

Modewarre led the Division 2 Competition at the end of the home and away season, with Werribee Centrals, Queenscliff and Anglesea close behind. After an exciting Finals series, Anglesea peaked at the right time to overcome a talented Modewarre in the Grand Final and take out a long-awaited flag from 4th position.

Noah Collins from Anglesea took out the Division 2 Best & Fairest medal with the leading Goalkicker being Ned Coffey from Queenscliff.

Only 4 points separated Drysdale, Torquay and St Joseph's at the top end of the Division 3 ladder coming into the finals with Drysdale filling top spot.

Drysdale powered their way straight to the Grand Final with a comfortable win over Torquay but had to fight hard to overcome a resurgent Geelong West Giants who had come through from fourth position, with Drysdale the eventual premiers by 5 points.

The Division 3 Best & Fairest winner was Christopher Tainton from Drysdale with his teammate Declan Foley the leading goalkicker.

BFNL

Only percentage separated Torquay and Drysdale at the top of the Senior BFNL ladder having only lost one game each 3 games clear of Barwon Heads with Modewarre another 2 wins back and Geelong Amateur completing the final 5. Torquay powered their way straight into the Grand Final with a comfortable win over Barwon Heads in the 2nd Semi Final, however Barwon Heads exacted revenge for their loss by convincingly defeating Torquay in the grand final rematch by 55 points, effecting a 130 point turn around.

Torquay Midfielder James Darke again took out the Les Ash Medal for a record equalling 4th time. Matthew Hebbard from Drysdale won the Goalkicking with 87 goals. Max Ruiter from Portarlington won the Geelong Advertiser award and Kye Annand from Ocean Grove was recognised as the BFNL Rookie of the year.

GFNL

UMPIRING REPORT

JOCK HILLGROVE

It is with great pleasure that I present this year's AFL Barwon Umpiring Department Annual Report.

Firstly, and foremost, I would like to thank all umpire's, Club and League appointed, in the Region for their dedication, commitment and particularly those that officiated in multiple games each weekend, without these dedicated people umpiring we could not have delivered the service to as many games.

We saw a record increase in our registered umpire numbers in 2022, +121 (572) from the COVID Impacted season in 2020 (425) to 2021 (451), breaking the previous heights of registered umpires from 2019 (507) in a great positive outcome for our Region.

The increase and record numbers were on the back of "club" appointed umpires registering into Officials HQ.

It is a goal for AFL Barwon to have all "Club" appointed persons registered into Officials HQ in the Region, allowing us to deliver greater opportunity for direct coaching and focussed guidance to all those people umpiring at every level of the game.

We know in doing so will allow us to grow the "AFL Club Umpire Engagement Program" to greater benefit to umpiring in our Region.

AFL Barwon "League" appointed Umpires, has started to bounce back to pre-Covid numbers and we finished with (292 Geelong, 57 Colac)

AFL Barwon League Umpire numbers has increased from 2021 but are still down from (pre-covid) 2019.

Colac Umpires are down 18% overall from pre-Covid numbers and is in urgent need of more umpires, particularly field and goal, to avoid Senior CDFNL football having to utilise club appointed umpires in 2023. This will be a key focus area for the AFL Barwon Umpiring Department for 2023.

Early morning Saturday and Sunday games were our main challenge in filling "league" umpire appointments in Geelong and we were unable to fill any home and away underage appointments in Colac at all. Diversify football fixtures to midweek and Fridays could be an avenue for clubs to think about, especially with the expected continued growth of junior and Female football to take some stress off the Saturday and Sunday time slots. Umpires doing 3 to 5 games a weekend is not a sustainable model and will lead to "burn out" and injury of these individuals. This is a serious issue the game faces that must be addressed in the immediate future.

In 2022, AFL Victoria employed Umpire Lead (Casual) to be a conduit for all online umpire enquiries, Molly McKenzie was appointed to this role for our Region and has been outstanding in the role, her achievements has seen a transition rate from enquiry to on field AFL Barwon appointments the highest in the State.

We had 96 people make an EOI through the unique AFL Umpire Enquiry page and gained 29 recruits from that platform alone, giving our Region a conversion rate of 30.21% which was a 24.65% increase on 2021 conversions.

AFL Victoria are holding our Region as the benchmark for further growth opportunity that this program can be and the success it can achieve with a dedicated people resource.

In total we had 57 (Geelong 48, Colac 9) new "League" umpires who began their umpiring journey with AFL Barwon.

Our AFL Barwon Umpiring Coaches in Geelong and Colac once again delivered an outstanding job. I would like to personally thank you all in your approach, support, and development of the umpire groups.

It was also pleasing to note that for the first time in many seasons, we had dedicated coaches in all disciplines in Colac and Geelong.

The role of our coaches is very time-consuming managing appointments, observations, assessments, and skill development training / coaching sessions up to twice per week. We will be looking to restructure how this is delivered to greater efficiency in 2023 by investing and using online video technology along with the further development of the Officials HQ Platform as an example.

Thank you to Larry Donohue (Appointments Coordinator – Geelong) for your commitment and effort in managing the Junior field and large number of changes that occurs each week. In 2022 we averaged around 35% absenteeism compared to 20% the previous season. With Covid still being a major impact from week to week. This is where we must thank the umpires who do multiple games each week and our Club Appointed umpires for being available to do extra games.

Many umpires achieved major milestones from their first games to debuting in Senior Football and reaching major finals adding to their development and experience. Congratulations to all those that have achieved their goals and successes to date.

We take this opportunity to also thank Rob Schuller (Ocean Grove Cobras) for your drive and determination, delivering the Cobras Umpire Academy for 2022 at your club, with 15 junior footballers from the U14/16 teams participating in umpiring your non-competitive age groups, some of the player/umpires transitioned to League Appointed Umpiring, the program continues to come leaps and bounds and be the benchmark for Umpire/club engagement in our Region.

We have had several "Cobra" player/umpires officiate in AFL Barwon Home and Away matches, Junior and Senior Finals in 2022, which is a testament to the program, and it's continued success.

The success of this partnership allowed AFL Barwon and AFL Victoria to have Ocean Grove Cobra player/umpires participate in the AFL Auskick matches at Geelong home games, an exciting opportunity for all.

St Mary's FC also commenced a Junior Umpire Program in 2022 where a number of their player/umpires integrated into AFL Barwon Umpire training at Kardinia Park and we look towards expanding and formalising that arrangement further in 2023.

They regularly umpired non-competitive and as “League” appointed Junior Home and Away matches in 2022

As the “Club” Umpire program expands in 2023, we look to involving more clubs who have already indicated their want to be involved. It is worth noting that these “Club” Academies are not restricted to just junior players and could be aimed at older players in higher age groups including seniors.

The AFL Barwon V/Line Umpiring Academy conducted by AFL Victoria saw most of the umpires involved exposed to appointments in NAB Boys, NAB Girls, VFLW games and the V/Line Cup with ongoing expansion of the Academies and a genuine pathway to State League positions we are in a strong position to further establish our Talent Pathway for Umpires as one of the best in the State.

AFL Barwon Umpiring thanks the CDFUA and GFUL for their ongoing support of umpires and their members, a rewarding and challenging role for your Board’s, by working all together for the betterment of umpiring in the Region is and should always be the focus, thank you to Douglas Evans (CDFUA) and David Chaston (GFUL) for your leadership.

2022 also saw the introduction of a new National Registration, Appointments, Learning Management System (LMS) and Accreditation levels for all umpires called Officials HQ.

Like “Play HQ”, we have had to totally learn how the platform works and is used. Overall, we feel that it delivered in the key areas of registration, appointments, and umpire payments. With more improvements planned for a December release and into 2023, we look forward to a greater user-friendly administration and umpire experience.

In closing I would like to thank David Harris for his role within the AFL Barwon Umpiring Department, he has assisted me enormously. Coupled with his duties looking after the CDFNL Operations, David has made a big impact to AFL Barwon Operating team.

David will be “full time” in the AFL Barwon Umpiring Department in 2023 and he will be responsible for all umpire coaching and talent and development as his primary portfolio. David will be a

great asset to all umpires and football clubs having had many years of umpiring AFL football.

To Andrew Talbot, AFL Victoria, the AFL Umpiring Department, we thank you for your ongoing support in 2022.

Thank you to Neville Whitley, your executive, and all the GDFNL clubs for continuing to support umpiring.

To Peter Hickey and your board and clubs in the CDFNL in enabling umpiring to become a greater focal point in the direction of football within your League. There’s still a lot of work that needs to be done and with the help of Clubs we can succeed together.

To all my fellow colleagues at AFL Barwon I am immensely proud of all your work in 2022, we have had many changes and challenges thrown at us in 2022, yet I strongly believe we have delivered a very successful and enjoyable year. It was great to have footy back and finish all our seasons across the Region.

TRIBUNAL REPORT

MICHAEL LIMB

There was a total of 99 reports laid across AFL Barwon Leagues in the 2022 season. This was an increase of 22 from 2019 (last full season of games).

These reports comprised:

- 70 Senior Grade,
- 7 Reserve Grade,
- 8 Under 18s,
- 11 from Junior Grades,
- 1 Netball,
- 2 from Female Football.

The above are inclusive of 2 people who were acting as officials on the day.

- 8 of these reports were referred as a result of investigations,
- 38 were referred by the Match Review Panel
- 53 that were reported by the officiating umpires.

61 players accepted the set penalty option. A total of 161 matches will be or have been missed by players and/or officials through suspensions received in 2022.

Our Match Review Panel assessed 151 requests. 40 of these were of incidents reported on the day by the officiating umpire.

No or inconclusive vision – 30

Not deemed reportable – 59

They found 62 reportable offences. 48 of these players accepted set penalties, 16 players challenged their charge at tribunal, 4 clubs were fined for engaging in Melee. Of the 16 that were heard at Tribunal, 13 were found guilty.

A disturbing number of behavioral issues were identified throughout the year, predominantly in junior grades and far too often through poor leadership and role modelling by parents and coaches.

This is an area that will need to be addressed at club level with the support of all club administrators.

Our appreciation is extended to the members of the MRP who volunteered their time on a weekly basis to assess relevant footage as requested and provide their judgements. Tribunal results would indicate that their judgements were appropriate and reasonable.

I would again like to congratulate and thank Werner Weigl as Tribunal Chairperson for 2022. Werner provided professional leadership that complemented the astute and consistent delivery of fair and reasonable judgements by all panel members. He was again well supported by Amanda Evans who also held the chair when required throughout the season. Arthur Hodgson continued his excellent work as our League Prosecutor and ensures the most informed and balanced decisions can be made by the Tribunal Panel.

I would again like to thank Rob Drew for his work as Tribunal Secretary with the co-ordination, scheduling and running of the Tribunal sessions, I would also like to thank our Director of Umpiring Jock Hillgrove for his work coordinating and organizing the umpires in their role.

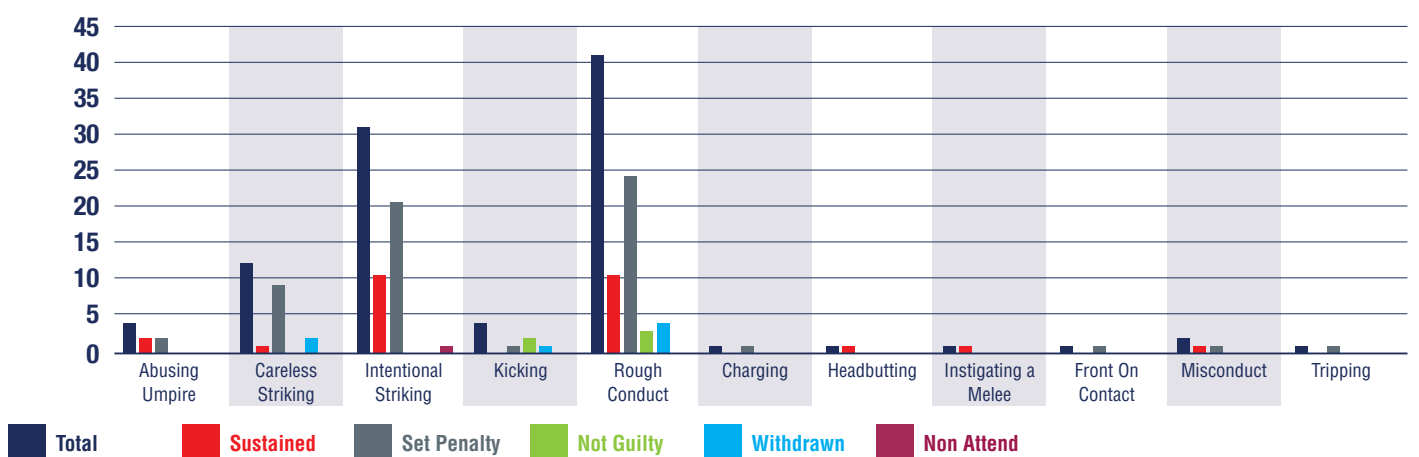
TOTAL REPORTS BY LEAGUE



2022 INVESTIGATIONS



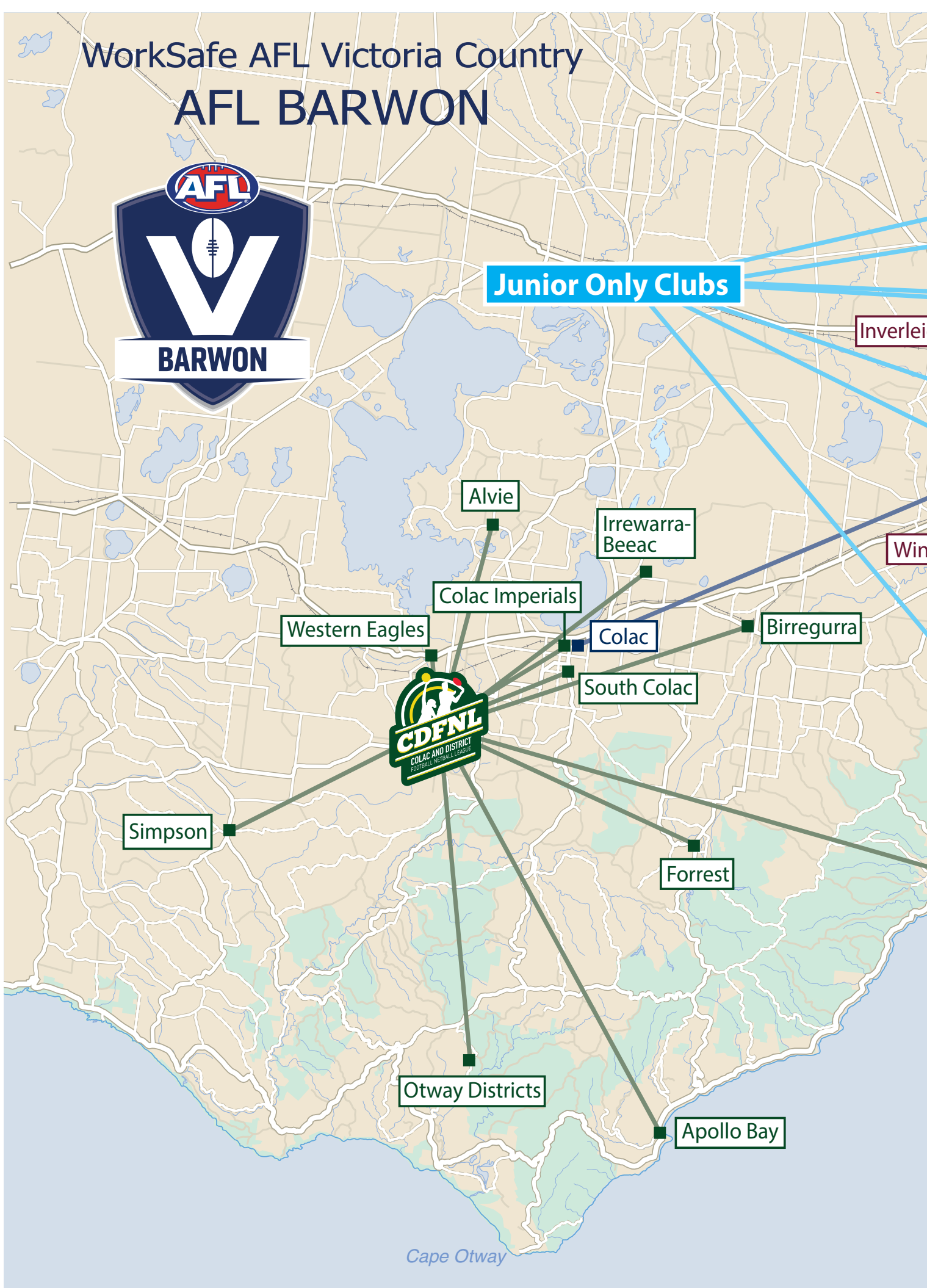

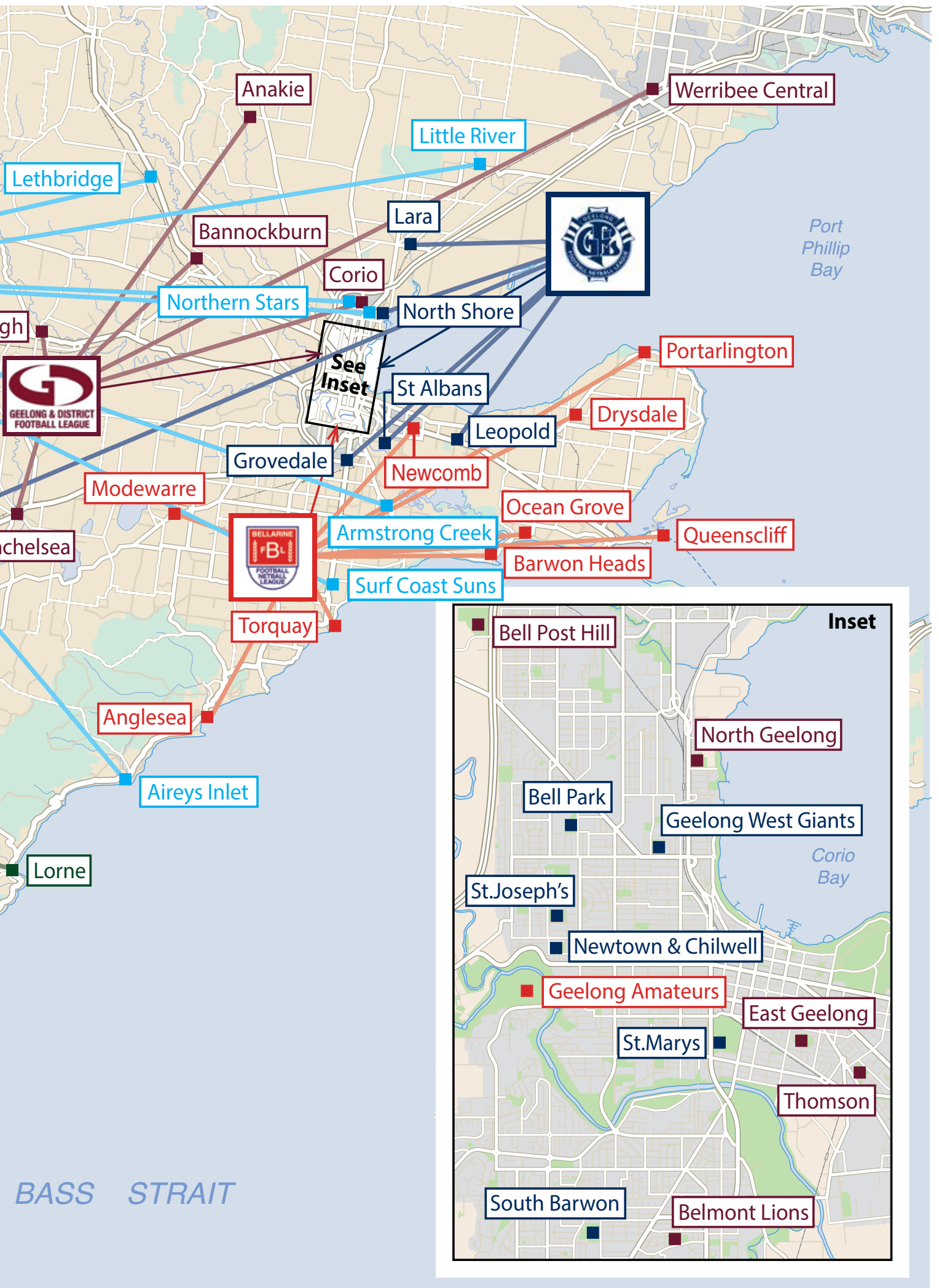

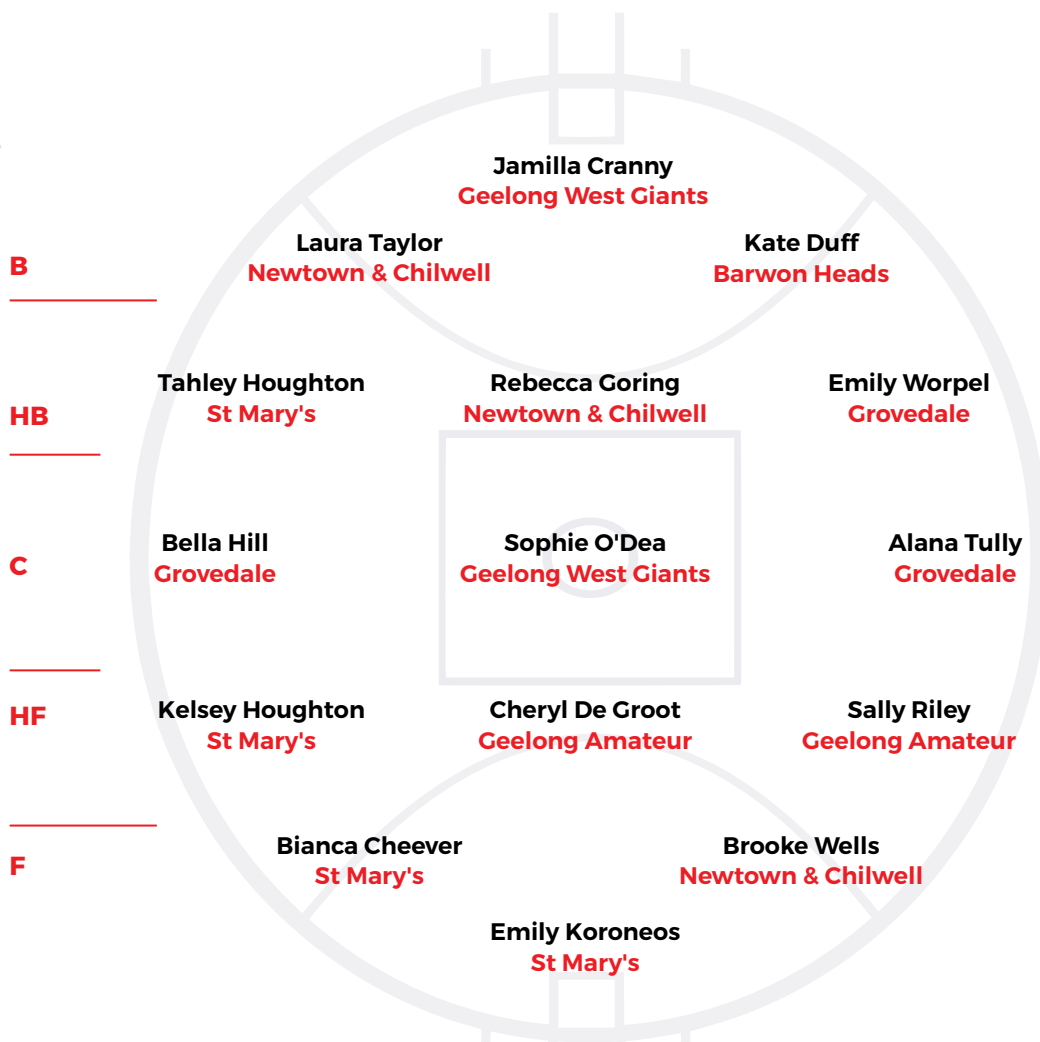

Results

The current year net loss amounted to \$13,840 (2021: net profit of \$199,182).

Short term and long-term objectives

The short term and long-term objectives of the company are to deliver on the Vision, Mission and Values as well as action the strategic plan, focusing on; Participation, Community, Engagement, Development and Welfare, Facilities, Sustainability and People & Culture.

Performance measurement

The company uses the following key performance indicators to measure performance;

No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.

The Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic continues to impact Metropolitan Melbourne, Regional Victoria and Nationally where the company has operations.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are for AFL Barwon Football Commission Limited an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. AFL Barwon Football Commission is a company limited by guarantee.

(a) Basis of preparation of the financial report

These general purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') and the *Corporations Act 2001*, as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

Historical Cost Convention

The financial report has been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Australian Accounting Standard's set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

(b) Revenue

Revenue, including government grant funding that is subject to a funding arrangement that is both enforceable and sufficiently specific regarding its purpose, is recognised at a point in time or over time, when (or as) the company satisfies performance obligations by transferring the promised goods to its customers.

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

Government grant funding provided to the company in accordance with a funding arrangement that is not both enforceable and sufficiently specific regarding its purpose, is recognised as revenue in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income when the company obtains control of the grant and it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the company and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

Interest revenue is recognised when it becomes receivable on a proportional basis taking in to account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(c) Income tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the company is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(d) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand and at banks, short-term deposits with an original maturity of three months or less held at call with financial institutions, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

(e) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(f) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

Depreciation

(g) Trade and other payables

(h) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the company has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

(i) Employee benefits

(i) Short-term employee benefit obligations

Liabilities arising in respect of wages and salaries, annual leave, accumulated sick leave and any other employee benefits expected to be settled within twelve months of the reporting date are measured at their nominal amounts based on remuneration rates which are expected to be paid when the liability is settled. The expected cost of short-term employee benefits in the form of compensated absences such as annual leave is recognised in the provision for employee benefits. All other short-term employee benefit obligations are presented as payables.

(ii) Long-term employee benefit obligations

Liabilities arising in respect of long service leave and annual leave which is not expected to be settled within twelve months of the reporting date are measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflow to be made in respect of services provided by employees up to the reporting date.

Employee benefit obligations are presented as current liabilities in the balance sheet if the entity does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the reporting date, regardless of when the actual settlement is expected to occur.

Contributions are made by the company to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses as incurred.

(j) Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs can include interest, amortisation of discounts or premiums relating to borrowings, ancillary costs incurred in connection with arrangement of borrowings, foreign exchange losses net of hedged amounts on borrowings.

Borrowing costs are expensed as incurred, except for borrowing costs incurred as part of the cost of the construction of a qualifying asset are capitalised until the asset is ready for its intended use or sale.

(k) Leases

The company has adopted AASB 16 from 1 November 2019. The standard replaces AASB 117 'Leases' and for lessees eliminates the classifications of operating leases and finance leases. Except for short-term leases and leases of low-value assets, right-of-use assets and corresponding lease liabilities are recognised in the statement of financial position.

Straight-line operating lease expense recognition is replaced with a depreciation charge for the right-of-use assets (included in operating costs) and an interest expense on the recognised lease liabilities (included in finance costs). For lessor accounting, the standard does not substantially change how a lessor accounts for leases.

The company has elected not to apply the recognition and measurement criteria above to:

- (i) *Short-term leases* – where the lease term does not exceed 12 months;
- (ii) *leases of low value assets* – leases for which the underlying asset has a fair value below \$10,000.

Lease payments for leases that have been designated as *short-term leases* or *leases of low value assets* are expensed on either a straight-line basis over the lease term or another systematic basis.

(l) Comparatives

Where required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

(m) Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements. Management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, contingent liabilities, revenue and expenses. Management bases its judgements, estimates and assumptions on historical experience and on other various factors, including expectations of future events, which management believes to be reasonable under the circumstances. The resulting accounting judgements and estimates will seldom equal the related actual results.

The judgements estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities (refer to the respective notes) within the next financial year are discussed below.

Employee benefits provision

As discussed in note 1(i), the liability for employee benefits expected to be settled more than 12 months from the reporting date are recognised and measured at the present value of the estimated future cash flows to be made in respect of all employees at the reporting date. In determining the present value of the liability, estimates of attrition rates and pay increases through promotion and inflation have been taken into account.

Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic

Judgement has been exercised in considering the impacts that the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic has had, or may have, on the Company based on known information. This consideration extends to the nature of the services offered, customers, and staffing. Other than as addressed in specific notes, there does not currently appear to be either any significant impact upon the financial statements or any significant uncertainties with respect to events or conditions which may impact the Company unfavourably as at the reporting date or subsequently as a result of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

Key estimates

Impairment

The company assesses impairment at the end of each reporting period by evaluating conditions and events specific to the company that may be indicative of impairment triggers.

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the financial report of AFL Barwon Football Commission Limited (the Company), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 31 October 2022, the statement of comprehensive income, the statement of changes in equity and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the director's declaration.

In our opinion, except for the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be necessary had the limitation discussed in the qualification paragraph not existed, the accompanying financial report of the Company is in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001*, including:

- (a) giving a true and fair view of the Company's financial position as at 31 October 2022 and of its financial performance for the year then ended; and

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Revenue Completeness
