

AFL BARWON CHAIR REPORT

2023 is a year to be proud of on many levels. It's the first year since 2019 that felt 'normal' and football and netball again took the focus off our weekends and there was a certain freedom about playing, watching and officiating unrestricted.

We also took major steps in setting the future direction of the region.

Our consultation process started by gathering feedback from all football and netball clubs in the region about what the key focus areas should be in the next three to five years.

Some of these focus areas remain the same such as the need to recruit and retain our football and netball umpires, upgrade facilities and help with the recruitment of volunteers, but two particular focus points resonated with the Commission; greater visibility of netball and creating a better plan for competition structures.

Netball deserves to be seen as an equal and should be elevated and celebrated on many levels. Our Clubs are now at least a fifty/fifty split of males and females and netball should be prioritised whether it's on social media or in our future planning.

The future of football and netball project is a great example of looking at our competition structures in junior and senior football and netball. Our concepts are bold and have considered the abundance of feedback from clubs and the need to attempt to provide structures that allow for equity and growth no matter where your club is located or what level of football/netball clubs aim to achieve.

Thank you to all clubs for their honesty and passion in providing feedback throughout our various consultation processes this year.

We look forward to further consultation with our clubs about these concepts and what the future of football and netball will look like in the coming years.

It was a changing of the guard in some respects with the AFL Barwon Commission in 2023. With Craig Keating completing his final term as Chair, I proudly assumed the role and through a recruitment process in late 2022, it was a Commission made up of many new faces and new ideas.

Our mantra was about spreading the load in 2023. With that several Commission sub-committees were developed to support the AFL Barwon staff group with key operational and strategic work.

Finance, Risk and Audit, Football & Netball Operations, Stakeholder Engagement, People & Culture and Future of Football & Netball sub-committees were developed with a Commission member assuming the chair position of each. With this initiative, we also changed the structure of the AFL Barwon Commission meetings from monthly to by-monthly allowing for each sub-committee to meeting in the off month.

I thank each of the Commission in 2023 for their hard work and dedication to these new structures. In my first year as chair, I have felt the support and enjoyed sharing ideas and the robust discussions that come with that.

I would like to thank Robert Hallet who finishes with the Commission at this next AGM after a 10-year term. Thanks, Bob, for your hard work and dedication to AFL Barwon. You will be missed.

Finally, a massive thank you to our wonderful group of staff led by Edward Wilson. We are so fortunate to have a dedicated and passionate group that care so deeply about football and netball in our region.



REGIONAL MANAGER REPORT

Every day leading AFL Barwon is an absolute privilege and to do so in a region that is immensely reach, brings great responsibility to support our Clubs, competitions, and leagues, to leave them in a better place than we found them.

For AFL Barwon in 2023, encapsulating this into everything we do was vital as we expanded our service delivery, and elevated the quality for which we led competitions and the region at large. For us, we cannot deliver these competitions and leagues, led community initiatives and drive positive outcomes for the region's 23,000 participants, if it wasn't for a dedicated cohort of volunteers and Club representatives, who even 17 months into my time with AFL Barwon, continue to amaze me with their passion and generosity.

The return of the AFL Barwon Community Awards in 2023 we hope as a small token of our appreciation for the incredible contributions many throughout our community made this year. As an organisation, we truly believe that all 51 affiliated Clubs are more than places to kick a footy, and shoot a netball, but rather are part of the fabric of their local community, and the wealth of formative developmental initiatives are testament to this.

In May 2023 following eight months of development, the AFL Barwon & Geelong Cats Strategic Partnership was launched. This partnership since its inception, has provided significant value to our community in-line with the partnership's five pillars – Community Engagement, Partnerships, Facilities & Environments, Membership & Participation, and Organisational Resourcing. The significant engagement experienced through the jointly delivered Female Festival of Sport week, the establishment of a 15-team U9 Girls Football competition (original aim of 4-6 teams in 2023)

and collective visions to driving facility development and growth across the region, has all been mutually beneficial aspects of this partnerships, in its initial months. To the Geelong FC CEO Steven Hocking, Chief of Strategy & Growth Marcus King, Head of Community Will McGregor and Community Engagement Manager Jess Dangerfield – thank you for your engagement with AFL Barwon, and we look forward to expanding our strategic partnership in 2024 to create greater club engagements, and elevate our region across a range of unique, outcome-driven opportunities.

The onboarding of the Club Development Officer and the subsequent recruitment of a full-time Club Development Lead, has presented for the first time, a full-time resource for Clubs to support their areas of opportunity and their individual ventures for growth and sustainability. The investment into this role, as well as the recent recruitment drive for a Group Manager – Operations, speaks to our belief that we need to be more than competition administrators, we need to actively support and drive greater value for our Clubs, to ensure Football & Netball continue to be the sport of choice, for so many across the Barwon region.

These changes elevate the value of our affiliations and furthermore, with Michelle Gerdtz assuming the AFL Barwon Commission Chair role in December 2022, AFL Barwon has experienced a governance evolution that drives greater decision making capacity and efficiency. The development of four sub-committees – across the streams of Finance, Operations, People & external engagement, have supported the internal team significantly and have increased the value we're able to deliver to all 51 Clubs, and our community partners. Thank you to Michelle, Deputy Chair Ashley West and the entire AFL Barwon Commission, for their continued support, engagement and expertise, which in my professional experience is second to none.

The partnership establishments, the role recruitments and governance evolutions detailed above, have all stemmed from the finalisation of AFL Barwon's new multi-year Strategic Plan. This document driven by actionable deliverables, has framed the strategic direction for the organisation, post significant consultation with all affiliated Clubs, community and government partners. AFL Barwon continues to be immensely proud of the community which we have the privilege of working a part of, who drive us for greater outcomes and in turn, supports our initiatives to capitalise on success, progress our region and support opportunities. Whether the establishment of the Colac Otway U10 & U12 15-team Football competition (original objective of 4-6 teams), the fourth season in-a-row of at capacity mid-week Netball competitions (despite playing across three venues – a first for AFL Barwon), or the change in Female Football age groups to promote greater development and support for players – these are just the start of the new Strategic Plan, delivering actionable deliverables within the region.

As aforementioned, it is a privilege to lead AFL Barwon and this privilege is elevated further by the incredible team that lead AFL Barwon every day. With a wealth of tenure, expertise and transferrable skills, their contributions and enthusiasm is admired and valued daily. We're proud to restore organisational culture, and role stability across the team, which has delivered greater outcomes for all stakeholders as a result. The internal team, in-line with the Commission, are committed to growing our delivery model to relief Club operational stress and therefore, increase the value our Clubs and competitions, provide to all community members.

FOOTBALL OPERATIONS REPORT

SIMON RIDDOCH

SENIOR MALE FOOTBALL & UNDER 18 MALE FOOTBALL

The 2023 season would be one of our most competitive season with several clubs in contention for the final five across the GFNL & BFNL. senior competitions. The Grand Finalists in the Blood Toyota GFNL came from third and fourth on the ladder with St Mary's and Colac both losing in straight sets. Torquay was the clear leading team in the Dow Bellarine FNL, with Barwon Heads and Drysdale testing the ladder leaders throughout the year. Drysdale was the big improver in 2023, winning their way through to the 2023 Dow BFNL Grand Final.

UNDER 18 MALE

The U18 section had a significant increase in teams from 25 teams in 2022 to 33 teams in 2023, a fantastic achievement by AFL Barwon regional clubs, Bell Post Hill & Anakie submitting teams with Anglesea, Drysdale, GWG, Newtown & Chilwell, Ocean Grove, St Joseph's, St Marys & Torquay providing two teams. AFL Barwon maintained 3 divisions comprising 10,13 and 10 teams competing respectively in each division.

In Division 1, Newtown & Chilwell finished the season as champions dominating the home and away and final series. St Marys, Torquay Leopold and Ocean Grove rounded out the top five.

Francesco Posterino from Newtown & Chilwell won his second League Best & Fairest / Jim Vivian Medal. St Mary's Jack Wilson was the Division 1 leading Goalkicker.

Anglesea won back-to-back Under 18 Division 2 Premierships with Bannockburn, Drysdale, Werribee Centrals and Newtown & Chilwell making up the five. Anglesea led the competition ladder all year, overcoming a tenacious Bannockburn in the Grand Final and taking back-to-back flags. Declan Foley from Drysdale took out the Division 2 Best & Fairest medal with Xavier Paatsch from Newtown & Chilwell the leading Goalkicker. The Ray Ettridge Medal was awarded to Max Murdock from Werribee Centrals.

Division 3 ladder leaders Portarlington had a challenging task making their way to the Grand Final with a two-goal loss in the Qualifying Final to South Barwon/Grovedale. They turned this around with a 19-point win against East Geelong in the Preliminary Final. Portarlington won it's first U18 Premiership since 2015 beating South Barwon/Grovedale. Ocean Grove Tyrrell and Anglesea Bews made up the top five. The Division 3 Best & Fairest winner was Luke Barry from East Geelong with Jesse Hunter from Portarlington winning the leading Goalkicker with 109 goals.



BFNL FOOTBALL

Torquay finished top of the Senior Dow Bellarine FNL 2023 ladder, having only lost one game for the season. Torquay was 2 games clear of Drysdale, Barwon Heads, Modewarre, and Anglesea at the end of the home and away season.

Torquay stormed into the Grand Final with a comfortable win over Barwon Heads in the 2nd Semi Final, however, Barwon Heads would exit the finals with their narrow loss by 9 points to Drysdale. Torquay won the grand final by 32 points in front of a massive BFNL crowd at Grinter Reserve.

Barwon Heads Ruck Luke Davis was a very surprised winner of the Les Ash Medal. In his acceptance speech, Luke was full of praise for his teammate and the Barwon Heads FNC. Lucas Anderson from Torquay won the goal kicking award with 74 goals. Ryan Jackman from Newcomb won the Geelong Advertiser Player of the Year Award and Edward McCoy from Torquay was rewarded as the BFNL Rookie of the Year.



GFNL FOOTBALL

At the summit of the GFNL Senior ladder, this season proved to be exceptionally competitive. By Round 10, Newtown & Chilwell led the ladder by percentage, closely followed by St Mary's Colac and St Joseph's, all tied at 32 points, with Leopold at 28 points and South Barwon at 24 points. Heading into the final round, three clubs—Newtown & Chilwell, Leopold, and South Barwon all sat at 48 points, contending for the double chance, while St Joseph's held 40 points, playing against Geelong West Giants at 36 points.



The last round unfolded with Newtown & Chilwell losing to Leopold, South Barwon securing a victory over Colac, and Geelong West Giants convincingly winning against St Joseph's. St Mary's claimed the top spot on the GFNL Seniors ladder with 60 points, securing the minor premiership one game ahead of Colac at 56 points, who in turn held a slim one-game advantage over South Barwon, securing a crucial double chance. Leopold finished with 52 points, and Newtown & Chilwell with 48 points, rounding off the top five, one win ahead of St Joseph's on 44 points and Geelong West Giants on 40 points. The rest of the competition faced the challenge of narrowing the gap in the upcoming pre-season.

In the Qualifying Final, South Barwon surprised St Mary's, winning by 3 points in challenging conditions at West Oval, thanks to a standout marking display by Mathieson medal winner Fraser Fort. The Grand Final showcased an epic battle between St Mary's and Leopold, where Leopold emerged victorious, securing their third GFNL Senior premiership in front of a massive local community football crowd at Leopold Memorial Reserve.

The Mathieson Medal witnessed a tie between South Barwon players Fraser Fort and Matthew Caldwell, joining past South Barwon winners Mark Corrigan (2007), Glen Wallace (2000), Shane Korth (1995), and Dennis Pacor (1992). Colac's Bailey Scott claimed the third spot, trailing by 3 votes. St Mary's Sam Dobson won the Goal kicking with 60 Goals. Ryan Abbott received the Geelong Advertiser award, Paddy De Grandi was honoured with The Krock Player of the Year, and Hunter Lewis from St Joseph's was named the GFNL Rookie of the Year.

It was fantastic once again to see Junior Football thrive in the Barwon region in 2023, highlighted by the tremendous work and dedication from club volunteers in support of their respective Club's Junior programs. The impact that you've had on these Juniors has been profound, and the dedication shown to the program by you all to is truly admirable. I'd like to thank all Clubs that put their hands up to host the 2023 Kempe Junior Football Finals Series, it is a monumental task, and it was brilliant to see so many dedicated volunteers take time out of

This year there were 98 teams entered across 7 age groups, this being 29 more teams than the 2022 season. JUNIOR NETBALL REPORT

2023 was a massive year for junior netball within the Geelong region. Congratulations to all clubs, volunteers, players and parents for all the work that went into making this year such a success. Thank you to Corio Bay Health Group, Kempe and Read the Play for sponsoring our Junior Competitions and Representative Program. It is due to your continued support that we have been able to grow our competitions and representative program.

The midweek competition started 2023 strongly with the 2022/23 Summer season being a record-breaking season having 227 teams fielded across both the Tuesday and Friday night competitions. Whilst coordinating so many teams proved tough at first, I would like to thank both Sophie and Rachael for helping me get the season underway. Rachael worked extremely hard to recruit and upskill the army of umpires and mentors needed to run this competition. The interest in the midweek competition continued to grow with the 2023 Winter season with an increase of team numbers for all age groups, including an increase of 38 teams across the 11&U (+21 teams) and 13&U (+17 teams) age groups. High team numbers meant the competition was played at numerous venues for each night. Thank you to Geelong Amateur, Ocean Grove and Geelong Sports Hub for their support in hosting games for the midweek competition and to our amazing umpire mentors for helping us run each venue. Thank you to all participants for fantastic Summer and Winter seasons, and congratulations to the premiers of each respective division. We look forward to seeing junior netball continue to grow, as seen in having another record-breaking Summer season with 274 teams participating.

This Winter Season we introduced Natasha and Emma as Netball Competition Coordinators who were amazing at helping us run our venues and with data entry through the season. We are very

grateful for their support and congratulate them on the fantastic relationships they have been able to create with teams, umpires, and mentors.

I would also like to thank all interns that supported netball operations and the wider AFL Barwon team throughout the season.

Our 2023 representative program generated a lot of interest at trials, and we were lucky enough to select 8 teams to represent AFL Barwon across the Bellarine FNL and Geelong FNL. We had one 13&U team, two 15&U teams and one 17&U team in each League. Barwon Junior Netball Championships returned this year, a competition run by Netball Victoria for representative teams in the region to help progress through the netball pathway. Three teams from each league competed in this competition, with all teams making the first week of finals. Grand finals saw three AFL Barwon teams take place, including a hard-fought battle between the BFNL and GFNL teams in the 13&U grand final. Congratulations to 13&U and 15&U Bellarine FNL for taking out the Championship. Our 15&U Reserve teams participated in the Geelong Central NA Monday night Open Junior Competition. Congratulations to both teams for making finals and to Geelong FNL for progressing through to Round 2 of finals.

All eight representative teams participated in the Central West Association Championships held in Altona in June. Two teams reached finals (13&U and 17&U BFNL sides) which saw the 13&U game go into extra time. Eight umpires also officiated for Association Championships with multiple officiating Finals and invited to the junior umpire program.

I want to say thank you to our amazing representative coaches. The program wouldn't be a success without you, and the players and AFL Barwon certainly appreciate the time and effort you put in to support the growth of players in the region. Thank you also to the parents of our representative players, we appreciate the support you provide your children and us throughout the season. We wish to congratulate all players, umpires and coaches on a fantastic season with the AFL Barwon representative program and we look forward to a great year in 2024.



FOOTBALL UMPIRING REPORT

JOCK HILLGROVE

It is with great pleasure that I present our 2023 AFL Barwon Umpiring Department Annual Report.

Firstly, and foremost, I would like to thank all umpire's, Club and League appointed, in the Region for their dedication, commitment and particularly those that officiated in multiple games each weekend, without these dedicated people umpiring could not have delivered the service to as many games as we were able to do.

We saw a record increase in our registered umpire numbers in 2023, +46 (618), from 2020 (425) to 2022 (572), again breaking the previous heights of registered umpires for the 2nd year running, a great positive outcome for our Region.

It is a goal for AFL Barwon to have all "Club" aligned persons registered into Officials HQ in the Region, allowing us to deliver greater opportunity for direct coaching and focussed guidance to all those people umpiring at every level of the game. We know in doing so will allow us to grow the "AFL Club Umpire Engagement Program" to greater benefit to umpiring in our Region and raise a greater investment into our umpire people and development resources.

AFL Barwon League Umpire numbers in Colac are down 20% since 2020 and is in urgent need of more umpires, particularly field and goal, to avoid Senior CDFNL football having to utilise club appointed umpires in 2024. This will be a key focus area for the AFL Barwon Umpiring Department for 2024, club buy in is paramount to assist in the dwindling numbers and help regrow umpiring in the CDFNL.

Early morning Saturday and Sunday games were our main challenge in filling "league" umpire appointments in Geelong and we were only able to fill home and away underage appointments with those registered as League umpires many of whom double or tripled up each day.

In the CDFNL we had 3 persons who umpired as "League" appointed each week below Senior

Grades with all other junior positions filled by "Club" umpires. AFL Barwon did utilise some "Club" umpires in the 2023 finals series.

In total we had 76 (Geelong 67, Colac 9) new "League" umpires who began their umpiring journey with AFL Barwon, there were a further 45 new "club" umpires registered.

Our AFL Barwon Umpiring Coaches and match day observers, the mentors and key support staff in Geelong and Colac who once again delivered an outstanding job. I would like to personally thank you all in your approach, support, and development of the umpire groups.

With the AFL Barwon Umpiring Department, delivering 8511 appointments in 2023, is a testament to all the hard work and dedication it takes to appoint, on average there were 453 umpire appointments achieved each week.

Thank you to Larry Donohue (Appointments Coordinator – Geelong) for your commitment and effort in managing the Junior field and Female umpire appointments along with many the changes that occur each week.

I would like to thank David Anderson (Colac) retiring, Eden Stubbing (Geelong), moving into an MDO role 2024, trainers Alan Doherty and Deb Tingiri (Geelong) and Sports Conditioning Austin Tattersall (Geelong) for their dedicated service to umpiring support and coaching. Whilst they are stepping away and pursuing other opportunities and family time, we know we will see you around.

AFL Victoria asked AFL Barwon to be part of the Women & Girls Development Coach Facilitator and Education Program pilot (AFL Victoria funded), which we greatly appreciated the opportunity to participate, Julie Ford was appointed as our facilitator for 2023.

AFL Barwon have also partnered with the Surf Coast Suns in delivering 2 umpire academies in 2023, A general academy for their junior players in which 12 footballers participated and completed the 4-hour course over the school holiday's the program was facilitated by Liam Clark and Henry Buckley (AFL Barwon), along with the inaugural Female Umpire Program (AFL Victoria) through September 2023 and engaging 10 young female participants who are new to umpiring. These participants also officiated in the AFLW Geelong Cats half time Auskick games. Thanks to Molly McKenzie from the AFL for facilitating.

We take this opportunity to also thank Rob Schuller (Ocean Grove Cobras) for your drive and determination, delivering the Cobras Umpire Academy for 2023 at your club, with 20 junior footballers from the U14/16 boys and girls teams participating in umpiring your non-competitive age groups, some of the player/umpires transitioning to "League Appointed" Umpiring, the program continues to come leaps and bounds and is the benchmark for Umpire/club engagement in our Region.

As the "Club" Umpire program expands in 2024, we look to involving more clubs who have already indicated their want to be involved. It is worth noting that these "Club" Academies are not restricted to just junior players and could be aimed at older players in higher age groups including seniors.

AFL Barwon Umpiring Department thanks the CDFUA and GFUL for their ongoing support of umpires and their members, a rewarding and challenging role for your Board's, by working all together for the betterment of umpiring in the Region is and should always be the focus, thank you to Douglas Evans (CDFUA) and David Chaston (GFUL) for your leadership.

In closing I would like to thank David Harris for his time with the AFL Barwon Umpiring Department, before moving to a role with AFL Victoria, he has assisted us enormously, David has made a big impact to AFL Barwon Operating team having also managed the AFL Barwon "All Abilities" competition.

Will Ross took up the opportunity to replace David and I have thoroughly appreciated Will's drive and enthusiasm to help support and grow umpiring in 2023. Will's role will be further expanded in 2024 as we move into 2024.

To David Harris and Leigh Bulwalda (AFL Victoria), the AFL Umpiring Department, we thank you for your ongoing support to us in 2023.

Thank you to Neville Whitley, your executive, and all the GDFNL clubs for continuing to support umpiring.

Jim Allen and your board and clubs in the CDFNL in enabling umpiring to become a greater focal point in the direction of football within your League. There's still a lot of work that needs to be done and with the help of all Clubs we can succeed together.

NETBALL UMPIRING REPORT

The 2023 season has been an exciting one in the netball umpiring space, with strides being made towards bridging the gap which was left post COVID-19. Prior to summer season in 2022, there were approximately 30 mid-week umpires. With significant growth in team numbers in our summer competition, there was a demand for the mid-week umpire numbers to increase. As a result of the work across the winter and summer seasons, we have grown our mid-week umpire numbers to 130. This has had a flow on effect, supporting umpire numbers for clubs in the Barwon region.

Further to this, we saw growth in our panel pool and have been extremely grateful to have attracted several talented umpires throughout the season. These umpires have been a great example for all young aspiring umpires transitioning into our panel group.

During 2023, we worked with several associations in the region to support the badging of our umpires. As a result, 19 AFL Barwon umpires achieved their C badge accreditation, 1 achieved their B badge and 1 A badge was awarded to an AFL Barwon umpire at the Victorian Netball League. AFL Barwon would like to thank and recognise Surfside Netball Association, Geelong Sports Hub and the Victorian Netball League for their support of AFL Barwon umpires and enabling the further development and badging of umpires from our Barwon region.

I would like to recognise all AFL Barwon mentors, who worked with umpires in our mid-week and Saturday competitions. Your dedication and commitment to our competitions is extremely valuable. Furthermore, thank you to LBW who have sponsored the umpires this season. Through the support of LBW, it has allowed for further training and development opportunities.

I would also like to congratulate the umpires who were selected in the Association Championships, which provides Talent Identification opportunities for umpires, as well as players. Several of the umpires at Association Champs were also awarded with finals due to their impressive performance.

Lastly, I would like to acknowledge our umpires who were awarded umpires awards at the conclusion of the 2023 season. The Junior Umpire Award was won by Erin McGinness for the Geelong Football Netball League and Emily Totton for the Bellarine Football Netball League. Ella Brown was awarded Best First Year Panel Umpire, Sophie Ford achieved Umpire Rising Star and Emily Green accomplished AFL Barwon Umpire of the Year.

Congratulations and thank you to all umpires for their tireless work throughout 2023. I look forward to seeing the further development of our umpires and guiding them on their umpiring journey.





TRIBUNAL REPORT

MICHAEL LIMB

There was a total of 158 reports laid across AFL Barwon Leagues in the 2023 season. This was an increase of 59 from 2022. The AFL's focus on dangerous tackles was reflected at local level with 59 reports issued for dangerous tackles.

These reports comprised

- 98 Senior Grade,
- 15 Reserve Grade,
- 21 Under 18s,
- 22 from Junior Grades,
- 0 Netball,
- 2 from Female Football.

The above are inclusive of 2 people who were acting as officials on the day:

- 4 of these reports were referred as a result of investigations,
- 41 were referred by the Match Review Panel
- 114 that were reported by the officiating umpires.

142 players entered an Early Guilty Plea. A total of 149 matches will be or have been missed by players and/or officials through suspensions received in 2023. There was a total of 53 reprimands issued.

Our Match Review Panel assessed 196 requests. 48 of these were incidents reported on the day by the officiating umpire.

No or inconclusive vision – 25

Not deemed reportable/withdrawn – 82

They found 89 reportable offences. 78 of these players entered early guilty pleas, 6 players challenged their charge at tribunal, 2 clubs were fined for engaging in Melee. Of the 6 that were heard at Tribunal, 5 were found guilty.

A disturbing number of behavioural issues were again identified throughout the year, predominantly in junior grades and far too often through poor leadership and role modelling by parents and coaches.

This is an area that will be addressed at league level in 2024, but will require the support of all club administrators.

Our appreciation is extended to the members of the MRP who volunteered their time on a weekly basis to assess relevant footage as requested and provide their judgements. Tribunal results and percentage of Early Guilty Pleas accepted would indicate that their judgements were appropriate and reasonable.






TOTAL REPORTS BY LEAGUE

The financial report covers AFL Barwon Football Commission Limited as an individual entity. AFL Barwon Football Commission Limited is a for-profit Company limited by shares, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

The functional and presentation currency of AFL Barwon Football Commission Limited is Australian dollars.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements, are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards - Simplified Disclosures and the *Corporations Act 2001*.

Historic Cost Convention

The financial statements, except for the cash information, have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The amounts presented in the financial statements ave been rounded to the nearest dollar.

The financial report has been prepared under the historical cost convention. Australian Accounting Standard's set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions.

Material accounting policy information relating to the preparation of these financial statements are presented below, and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

2 Material Accounting Policy Information

(a) Revenue

Revenue, including Government grant funding that is subject to a funding arrangement that is both enforceable and sufficiently specific regarding its purpose, is recognised at a point in time or over time, when (or as) the Company satisfies performance obligations by transferring the promised good to its customers. Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers

Government grant funding provided to the company in accordance with a funding arrangement that is not both enforceable and sufficiently specific regarding its purpose, is recognised as revenue in the statement of profit of loss and other comprehensive income when the company obtains control of the grant and is is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the Company and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

Interest revenue is recognised when it becomes receivable on a proportional basis taking in to account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and service tax (GST).

(b) Income tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the company is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand and at banks, short-term deposits with an original maturity of three months or less held at call with financial institutions, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position

(d) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(e) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses.

Plant & equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis. The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets is depreciated over their estimated useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Depreciated on a straight line basis.

(h) Employee benefits

(i) Short-term employee benefit obligations

Liabilities arising in respect of wages and salaries, annual leave, accumulated sick leave and any other employee benefits expected to be settled within 12 months of the reporting date are measured at their nominal amounts based on the remuneration rates which are expected to be paid when the liability is settled. The expected cost of short-term employee benefits in the form of compensated absences such as annual leave is recognised in the provision for employee benefits. All other short-term employee benefit obligations are presented as payables.

(ii) Long-term employee benefit obligations

Liabilities arising in respect of long service leave and annual leave which is not expected to be settled within 12 months of the reporting date are measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflow to be made in respect of services provided by employees up to the reporting date. Employee benefit obligations are present as current liabilities in the balance sheet if the entity does not have any unconditional right to defer settlement for at least 12 months after the reporting date, regardless of when the actual settlement is expected to occur. Contributions are made by the company to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses as incurred.

(i) Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs can include interest, and amortisation of discounts or premiums relating to borrowings, ancillary costs incurred in connection with an arrangement of borrowing, foreign exchange losses net of hedged amounts on borrowings. Borrowing costs are expensed as incurred except for borrowing costs incurred as a part of the cost of the construction of a qualifying asset are capitalised until the asset is ready for its intended use or sale.

(j) Leases

The Company has adopted AASB 16 from 01 November 2019. The standard replaces AASB117 leases and for lessees eliminates the classification of operating leases and finance leases. Except for short-term leases and leases of low value assets, right of use assets and corresponding liabilities are recognised in the statement of financial position. Straight line operating lease expense recognition is replaced with a depreciation charge for the right of use assets (included in operating costs) and an interest expense on the recognised lease liabilities (included in financial costs). For lessor accounting, the standard does not substantially change how a lessor accounts for leases.

The Company has chosen not to apply the recognition and measurement criteria above to:

(i) Short-term leases - where the lease term does not exceed 12 months

(ii) Leases of low value assets - leases for which the underlying asset has a fair value below \$10,000

Lease payments for leases that have been designated as short-term leases or leases of low value assets are expensed on either a straight line basis over the least term or another systematic basis.

Management continually evaluates its judgments and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, contingent liabilities, revenue and expenses. Management bases its judgments, estimates and assumptions on historical experience and other various factors, including expectations of future events, which management believes to be reasonable under the circumstances. The resulting accounting judgments and estimates will seldom equal the related actual results. The judgments estimates and assumptions that have significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities, refer to the respective notes, within the next financial year are discussed below.

Employee benefits provision

As discussed in note 2(h) the liability for employee benefits, the liability for employee benefits expected to be settled more than 12 months from the reporting date are recognised and measured at the present value of the estimated future cash flows to be made in respect of all employees at the reporting date. In determining the present value of the liability, estimates of attrition rates and pay increases through promotion and inflation have been taken into account.
