FDM Report- AFL Barwon

Development

As Football Development Managers we have successfully delivered Development Programs for AFL Victoria, as well as producing critical outcomes for the AFL Barwon Region through targeted League/Club Development Programs and strategies throughout 2016.

Participation

Our continued focus of developing and supporting all pillars of the game, from NAB AFL Auskick to Open-Age football, ensured that participation across the State and Region continued to develop:

- We were able to support 2,992 NAB Auskick participants, with numbers affected by transition from Auskick through to Junior Football at an earlier age and we will be working on strategies to increase participation in our Junior Programs.
- We supported all of our AFL School Ambassadors and School Competition Programs and were fortunate enough to host all School/Multicultural Ambassadors and Auskick Coordinators at a Pre-Season Function at Simonds Stadium in March.
- We continued to promote the game of AFL 9s to school participants through the Sporting Schools Program and built upon the success of the Social Competition that is operated and ran by the Deakin YMCA.
- We conducted School Holiday Programs for 130 participants, as well as a Footy Inflatables Promotion at Waurin Ponds Shopping Centre for over 2000 kids.

Community

We supported all of the AFL Barwon affiliated Leagues in regard to the management, structure and best practices of all our Clubs, as well as developing environments that seek to motivate committee members, volunteers, umpires and coaches at all levels in the Barwon region:

- We worked with all of the GFNL, BFNL, GDFL, CDFNL, GFUL and CFUL Football and Netball Clubs to implement outcomes that are outlined in the recently released G21 and AFL Barwon Strategic Plan. This included testing all football ground lighting across the Region.
- We continued to deliver our 'Community Education Presentations' to AFL Barwon aligned Clubs, which included topics consisting of: Vilification and Discrimination, Cyberbullying, Respect and Responsibility, Gambling and Drug & Alcohol Awareness.
- We accredited over 200 coaches through our Senior, Youth and Junior/Auskick Coaching Courses.
- The Annual Coach of the Year Dinner for 205 guests was held, recognising the outstanding work of our Coaches and Volunteers in the AFL Barwon Region.
- 3 coaches/coordinators were also recognised at state level. Congratulations to Tim Foley, Peter Saw and Alissa Bellears.

Engagement

We developed engagement initiatives, particularly within the multicultural and indigenous areas, as well as continuing to engage girls into football to grow female environments into the future:

- The Geelong Diverse Academy or 'Steven Motlop Squad' continued, giving approx. 60 players from diverse backgrounds, to learn the skills of AFL and develop as players and people.
- AFL Barwon and the Geelong Cats continued to strengthen its relationship with the Next Generation Academy program gaining momentum and building on its structure leading to an exciting 2017.
- We promoted girls football through a 'Come and Try' day at Simonds and introduced a U/12 competition to develop pathways.

Fans

We worked hard to develop our 'fans of the game' by working closely with the Geelong FC:

- We coordinated all of the AFL Player Appearances for Geelong FC players at approx. 90 schools, 40 junior clubs and 40 NAB Auskick centres and extra visits.
- We ran a NAB Auskick Superclinic for approx. 1,600 participants at Simonds as well as the Geelong FC Junior member's clinic for approximately 800 kids.

Best Talent

We also successfully managed and coordinated the V/Line Cup program for 50 U/15 boys and 25 girls, as well as our active involvement with the Worksafe Community Championships, Herald Sun Shield School football and other representative games at club and school levels. This year also saw the introduction of the Colac Academy, 35 boys from the Colac region participated in the 8 session program.

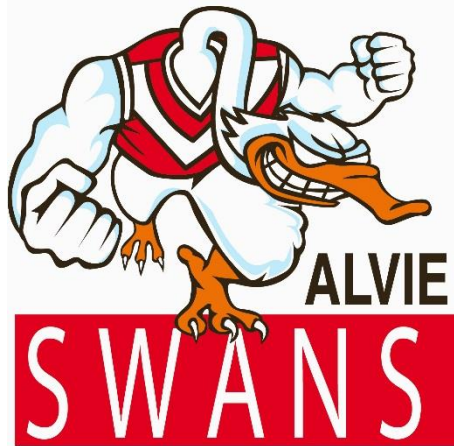

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General Information

The financial report is a special purpose financial report, which has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012. The financial report is prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The financial report covers the Colac and District Football Netball League Inc. as an individual entity. The Colac and District Football Netball League Inc. is an association incorporated in Australia under the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Association in the preparation of the financial statements.

Basis of Preparation

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

(a) REVENUE RECOGNITION

The recognition of Revenue for all departments is recognised in the year in which it is earned.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Finals & Sponsorship revenue is recognised upon receipt.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

(b) CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(c) TRADE RECEIVABLES

Debtors are carried at amount receivable. The collection of debts is assessed on an ongoing basis and specific provision is made for any doubtful accounts. Debts, which are known to be uncollectable, are written off.

(d) TRADE PAYABLES

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the company during the reporting period which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(e) INCOME TAX

The entity is an association established for the promotion and encouragement of sport or game as described under section 23(g)(iii) of the Income Assessment Act, and therefore, is exempted from ordinary income tax and all of its income.

(f) GOODS AND SERVICES TAX (GST)

The Association is not registered for GST purposes. Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised inclusive of the amount of GST.

(g) COMPARATIVE FIGURES

Where required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

The 2015 revenue and expenses have been reduced by the petty cash float to be consistent with the 2016 year.

Report on the financial report

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Colac and District Football Netball League Inc. (the Association), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 31 October 2016, the statement of revenue and expenditure, the statement of changes in equity, and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the committee declaration on the annual statements.

The committee's responsibility for the financial report

The Committee of the Association is responsible for the preparation of the financial report, and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1, is appropriate to meet the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic)* and is appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The Committee's responsibilities also includes such internal control as the officer determines is necessary to enable the preparation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Those Standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

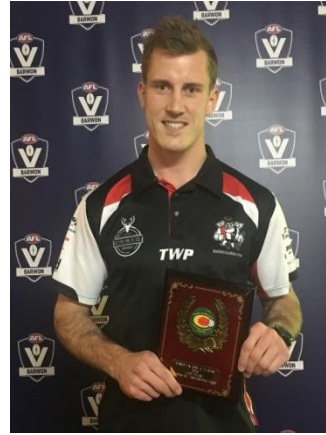
