# AFL Barwon Report

2021 was another season of challenges and uncertainty with the Covid-19 pandemic impacting on our community football and netball competitions across the AFL Barwon Region. What started as a positive outlook that the dramas of 2020 were behind us, it ended up the reason for us putting a halt to our seasons at the most frustrating point in time. The positive that we were able to get participants of all ages back playing community sport this year outweighs the disappointment of non-completed season.

In similar circumstances to the 2020 season, there was a constant monitoring of State Government announcements and consultation with local health experts meant AFL Barwon staff had to continually provide updates to clubs on the state of play. The AFL Barwon region was one of the final regions to declare a cancellation to our seasons after Victorian Government's Roadmap to deliver the National Plan didn't allow community sport to continue within the timeframes of our season dates. Whilst we continued to push the season dates back, unfortunately time eventually was against us.

It can't be underestimated the amount of work and time it required for volunteers to make sure football and netball was able to be played in 2021. There were extra responsibilities and requirements enforced on clubs each training night or match day as per Government restrictions. Every club volunteer from the President through to the COVID marshals need to be thanked for their efforts this season. We thank the clubs for their continuous support of AFL Barwon this year.

Whilst there wasn't a full season of Football and Netball completed, there were some key projects that took place throughout the season. The G21 & AFL Barwon Regional Strategy – Towards 2030 received final approval and adoption by all 5 local government areas. This strategy will give the region a full understanding of the investment requirements into infrastructure and the strong plans to be put in place to drive our sports forward. There were also projects undertaken looking at the junior netball competition structures and junior football pathways in the Colac Region. These two projects are key for the long-term sustainability of the region and to ensure participation and enjoyment continues to thrive.

**NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**General information**

The financial report is a special purpose financial report, which has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012. The financial report is prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The financial report covers the Colac and District Football Netball League Inc. as an individual entity. The Colac and District Football Netball League Inc. is an association incorporated in Australia under the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Association in the preparation of the financial statements.

**(a) Basis of preparation of the financial report**

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

**(b) Revenue**

Revenue, including government grant funding that is subject to a funding arrangement that is both enforceable and sufficiently specific regarding its purpose, is recognised at a point in time or over time, when (or as) the Association satisfies performance obligations by transferring the promised goods to its customers.

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

Government grant funding provided to the Association in accordance with a funding arrangement that is not both enforceable and sufficiently specific regarding its purpose, is recognised as revenue in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income when the Group obtains control of the grant and it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the Group and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

Finals & Sponsorship revenue is recognised upon receipt.

Interest revenue is recognised when it becomes receivable on a proportional basis taking in to account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

**(c) Income tax**

The entity is an association established for the promotion and encouragement of sport or game as described under section 23(g)(ii) of the Income Assessment Act, and therefore, is exempted from ordinary income tax and all of its income.

**(d) Cash and cash equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand and at banks, short-term deposits with an original maturity of three months or less held at call with financial institutions, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

(j) Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements. Management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, contingent liabilities, revenue and expenses. Management bases its judgements, estimates and assumptions on historical experience and on other various factors, including expectations of future events, which management believes to be reasonable under the circumstances. The resulting accounting judgements and estimates will seldom equal the related actual results.

The judgements, estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities (refer to the respective notes) within the next financial year are discussed below.

Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic

Judgement has been exercised in considering the impacts that the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic has had, or may have, on the Association based on known information. This consideration extends to the nature of the services offered, customers, and staffing. Other than as addressed in specific notes, there does not currently appear to be either any significant impact upon the financial statements or any significant uncertainties with respect to events or conditions which may impact the Association unfavourably as at the reporting date or subsequently as a result of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

Key estimates

Impairment

The Association assesses impairment at the end of each reporting period by evaluating conditions and events specific to the Association that may be indicative of impairment triggers.

(k) New Accounting Standards and Interpretations not yet mandatory or early adopted

Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations that have recently been issued or amended but are not yet mandatory, have not been early adopted by the Association for the annual reporting period ended 31 October 2021.

## Independent Auditor's Report To the Members of Colac and District Football Netball League Inc.

### Qualified Opinion

We have audited the financial report of Colac and District Football Netball League (the Association), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 31 October 2021, the statement of comprehensive income, the statement of changes in equity and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the committee's declaration.

In our opinion, except for the effects of such matters described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section in our report, the accompanying financial report of the Association is in accordance with the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic), including:

- (a) giving a true and fair view of the Association's financial position as at 31 October 2021 and of its financial performance for the year then ended; and
- (b) complying with Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note 1 and the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic).

### Basis for Qualified Opinion

As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practical for the Association to maintain an effective system of internal control over receipts until their initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, our audit in relation to revenue was limited to amounts recorded.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the Association in accordance with the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

### Emphasis of Matter – Subsequent Event - COVID-19

We draw attention to Note 10 of the financial report, which describes the effects of the Covid 19 epidemic in Metropolitan Melbourne and Regional Victoria as part of the Victorian Government State of Disaster. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.



### Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Association's financial reporting responsibilities under the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic). As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

### Responsibilities of the Directors for the Financial Report

The Committee of the Association is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1 to the financial report is appropriate to meet the needs of the members and the financial reporting responsibilities under the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic) and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial report, the Committee is responsible for assessing the Association's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Committee either intend to liquidate the Association or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.

### Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial report as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of this financial report.

As part of an audit in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards, we exercise professional judgement and maintain professional scepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. However, future events or conditions may cause the Association to cease to continue as a going concern.
